Farewell to the 2020-21 School Year...

We did it together. Another school year is in the rearview mirror. Our Boys & Girls Club served 220 children from 130 families in our community. Five tutors and 13 staff provided academic assistance throughout the year to our members to deliver a little extra support with their study plans. Tutors engaged virtually and consistently. We recently started collaborating with the Foster Grandparent Program through the Land of Sky Regional Council, and five of our six summer tutors have answered the call to serve with this initiative. Federally funded by the Corporation of National and Community Service, the program provides opportunities for seniors to impact the lives of children in their community (Land of Sky, 2021). It's a match made in heaven, as far as we are concerned.

This year, we ran our inaugural in-house basketball league serving grades 1st through middle school, comprised of seven teams. 100% of the Club's basketball players reported they learned new skills (or improved skills), and felt like the coaches listened to and cared about them, pushed them to do their best, and wanted them to be successful. 100% of parents believed their children felt more invested in the Our Boys 12U Flag Football team Club and felt an increased sense of camaraderie. A whopping 86 children were served through sports programs at the Club during the 2020-21 School Year.



Mentors Make a Difference

We are fortunate to have 16 mentors invested in 24 Club members through our mentoring program. It's another way staff can build intentional relationships with our kids who might want a little something extra from us. Mentors and mentees spend an hour together every other week as schedules allow. The children have great input into what they would like to learn, see, or do with their mentors. Occasionally, all of our mentors and mentees get together to celebrate each other and JUST HAVE FUN! Well, maybe there is some work involved...seven staff, five mentees, and two parents came together this

Bartlett Tree Experts donated mulch.
